



Communication about shellings

We developed clear protocols and coordination procedures with military and relevant agencies in the process of information preparation

- 🔴 we cannot communicate the shelling of military targets
- 🔴 We don't provide specific addresses → we employ phrases such as "in one of the city's districts"
- 🔴 We never specify facility names → we utilize general terms such as "administrative structure" or "industrial facility"

It is also important to carefully review video and photo materials so that there are no military personnel or critical infrastructure facilities in the footage

- ✓ We employ close-up shots and maintain strict information security protocols
- ✓ When necessary, we apply digital blurring techniques (retouching), particularly for casualties of enemy attacks




We have developed the "Mine Action Ukraine" and "MineFree" applications to inform the public about potentially hazardous areas

3 659
